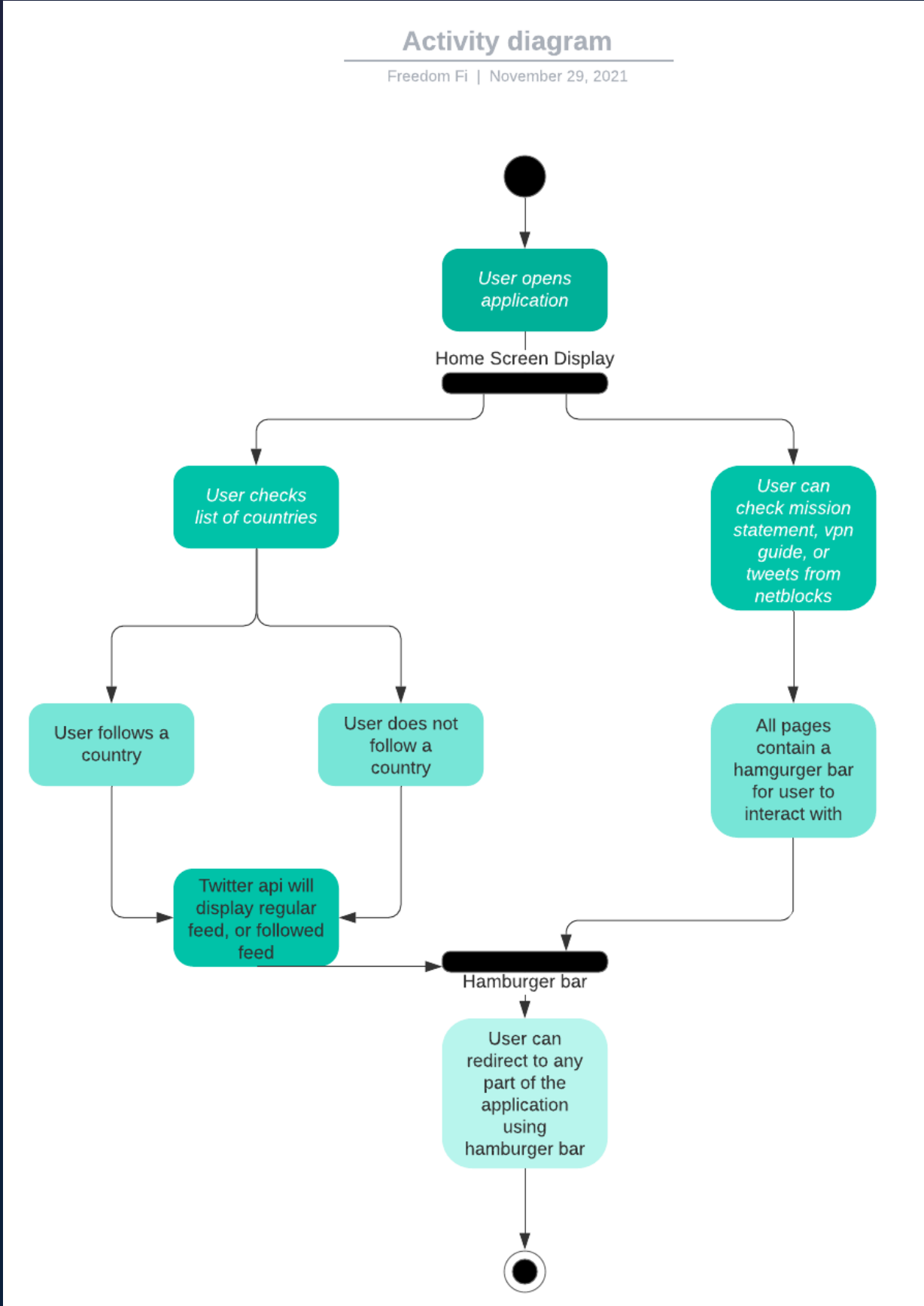

SYSTEM DESIGN



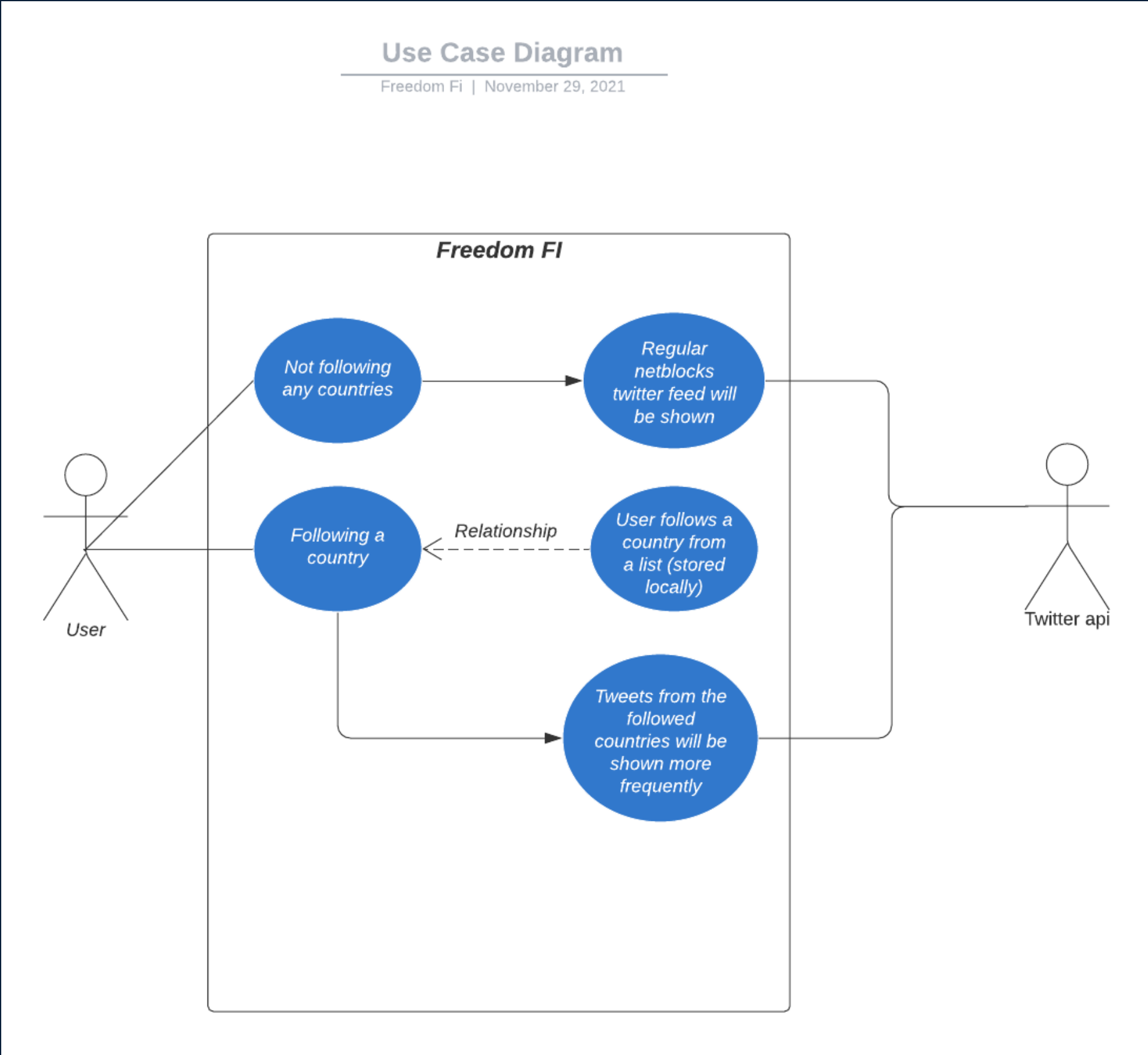
VERIFICATION
