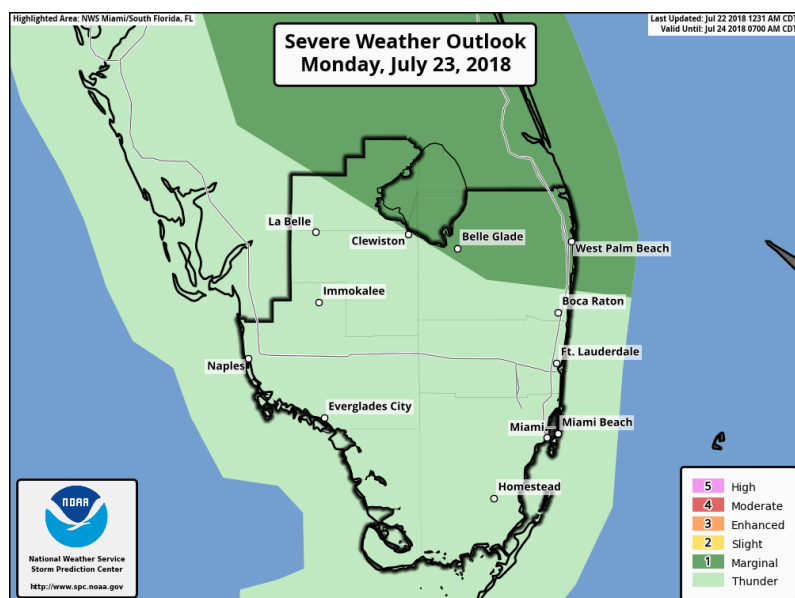


National Weather Service Miami - South Florida

Impact Weather Briefing for: Sunday, July 22, 2018

WATCHES/ADVISORIES: None at this time

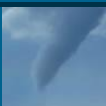


OVERVIEW: A system moving into the southeastern US will enhance storm chances the next few days across South Florida. Locally heavy rainfall, and a few severe storms are possible. In addition, the westerly flow will bring heat indices in the 104 to 110 range along the east coast each afternoon.

Sunday: Storms will continue to develop through the morning and afternoon, moving from west to east across the region. The potential will exist for isolated severe thunderstorms, primarily as damaging wind gusts though isolated tornadoes can't be ruled out particularly along the east coast.

Monday: A similar pattern is expected on Monday, with the threat for severe thunderstorms currently highest around the Lake Okeechobee region Monday afternoon. Locally heavy rainfall and the potential for minor flooding will also be a threat.

POTENTIAL IMPACTS

	 LOW	FLOODING: - Minor flooding of streets and poor drainage areas - Ponding of water may lead to brief lane closures, affecting travel
	 LOW	WIND: - Minor damage to porches, awnings, carports, and sheds - Many large tree limbs broken off - Some fences and roadway signs blown over
	 LOW	TORNADOES: Isolated tornadoes are possible
